CALL TO HEAL

Justice requires an honest and comprehensive assessment of past harms and current harms experienced by African peoples around the world as a result of the crimes of slavery, colonialism, neocolonialism and its legacies. Reparations and healing are critical building blocks for a justice-centered world in which the human rights of all people are protected. The Diaspora Affairs Office of the President advocates for the importance of racial healing to take place and justice to be advanced in this newsletter. We encourage all people of the African diaspora to reconnect with the continent for healing and advocacy.

"Although no amount of money can restore the damage and atrocities caused by the transatlantic slave trade, it is important to recognize its impact taking the steps towards reparations and racial healing by people of African descent". The President of the Republic, H.E Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo further highlighted that the effects of the Slave Trade have been devastating to the African continent and to the African Diaspora, with the entire period of slavery stifling Africa's economic, cultural and psychological progress. 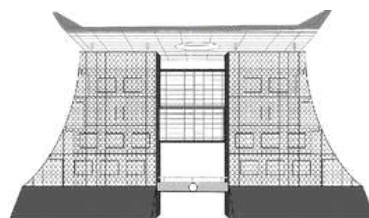

MEETING WITH THE PRIME MINISTER OF BARBADOS

During the Reparations and Racial Healing Summit, President Akufo-Addo underscored the need for a universal conversation on reparations, lamenting the need for people of African descent to receive justice at the summit. This call for reparations, he emphasized, transcends borders, demanding a collective endeavour for justice and healing.

Responding to the momentum generated by the summit, Director Akwasi Awua Ababio embarked on a pivotal weeklong working study tour in Barbados, facilitated by the Economic Social & Cultural Council (ECOSOCC), the Caribbean Pan African Network, and in collaboration with the African Union, along with support from the Open Society Foundation. This immersive initiative aimed to deepen the understanding of Racial Healing and foster inclusive engagement among stakeholders. It complemented the 42nd Ordinary Session where the AU Executive Council adopted a resolution on reparations.

The Prime Minister of Barbados H.E Mia Mottley of met with Director Akwasi Awua Ababio at Ilaro Court, her official residence in Bridgetown. She hosted Ambassadors and representatives from selected Member States of the AU, CARICOM and Latin America. This marked a crucial juncture in the weeklong working tour, dedicated to exploring reparations and racial healing. The discussions held during this encounter demonstrated a steadfast commitment to addressing the persistent impact of slavery and colonialism across global diaspora communities, and building bridges towards developing a global campaign.

The collaborative essence of this gathering underscores the shared determination of nations to unravel the complexities of historical injustices, forging a path towards a more equitable future. As we engage in transformative dialogue and cultivate connections, the resonance of this journey will extend beyond borders, ushering in a world where reparative justice and racial healing form the bedrock of unity, comprehension, and advancement.

Commissioning of the Redeveloped Kwame Nkrumah Park

In a momentous event on July 4th, 2023, President Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo unveiled the rejuvenated Kwame Nkrumah Memorial Park, marking a significant milestone in Ghana's history. The park, initially established in 1992 during the tenure of President Jerry John Rawlings, has been meticulously restored and modernized to pay homage to Ghana's first President, Kwame Nkrumah, and his vital role in the country's path to independence.

Under the visionary leadership of Minister for Tourism, Arts and Culture, Ibrahim Mohammed Awal, the park's revitalization has transformed it into a remarkable testament of Ghana's heritage. The park now features modern amenities such as a Presidential library, a mini-amphitheatre, and a restaurant, all catering to an enhanced visitor experience. Notably, the mausoleum housing Kwame Nkrumah's remains has been painstakingly refurbished, and the museum expanded with an innovative audio-visuals tunnel, offering visitors a deeper insight into his monumental contributions.

This ambitious project, costing GH¢30 million, aligns with the government's broader vision of positioning the Kwame Nkrumah Memorial Park as a premier cultural and historical attraction in West Africa. As the park opens its doors, the global Ghanaian Diaspora is encouraged to take part in preserving their heritage, connecting with their roots, and celebrating the enduring legacy of Kwame Nkrumah. This revitalized landmark stands as a testament to the nation's commitment to honouring its past while inviting the Diaspora to be an integral part of shaping its future.



DIRECTOR MEETS WITH CHIEF OF OSU

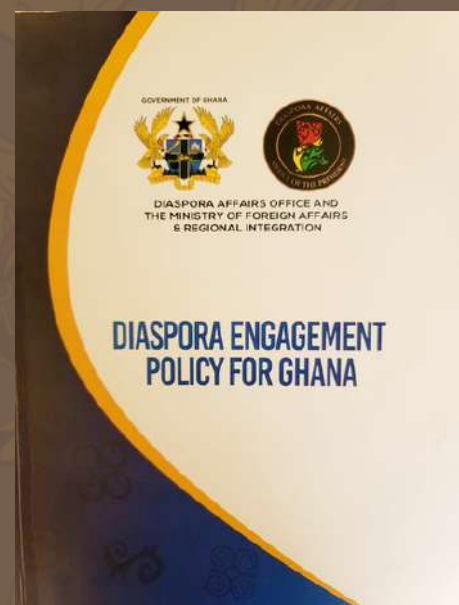


DIASPORA ENGAGEMENT POLICY TECHNICAL COMMITTEE MILESTONE

The collaborative efforts of key stakeholder culminated in a pivotal moment as the Technical Working Committee, composed of the Diaspora Affairs Office of the President (DAOOP), the Diaspora Affairs Unit of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Regional Integration (MoFARI), and the Centre for Migration Studies, University of Ghana, presented the policy to the Cabinet Sub Committee on Governance. The outcome was a success—the Committee welcomed and accepted the policy, propelling it forward for Cabinet's consideration. This marked a substantial stride towards the comprehensive implementation of the policy's transformative vision.

The Diaspora constitutes a reservoir of potent assets for any nation. Their influx brings not only financial capital but also diverse skill sets and a global perspective that, when effectively harnessed, can be instrumental in propelling a country forward. Ghana's Diaspora holds the potential to play a pivotal role in elevating the nation's trajectory, catalyzing growth through strategic investments, fostering brain gain through infrastructure development, and forging meaningful connections via media and engagement platforms. 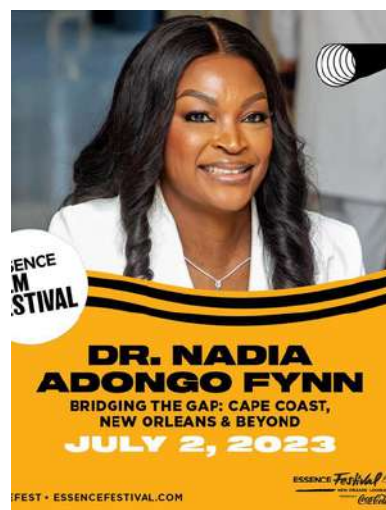


THE ESSENCE FESTIVAL (GHANA DAY)

Dr. Nadia Adongo Fynn, Deputy Director of the Diaspora Affairs, Office of the President spoke at the Annual Women's Conference in Toronto, Canada. In her remarks she emphasized the transformative role of women in society during. She acknowledged the power, resilience and potential of women by highlighting three key points: women's nurturing and empathetic nature, women historically igniting societal change, breaking barriers, and demanding justice and women's drive of innovation and progress across various fields. Dr. Nadia acknowledges challenges women face, including gender bias, work-life balance struggles, lack of support and mentorship, underrepresentation, and the glass ceiling. On the mission of galvanising leaders to impact the lives of women in the diaspora, Dr. Nadia honored the invitation by the City of East Point, representing Ghana and paving the way for a sister city collaboration for diaspora engagement. Meeting the esteemed figures, the first black female mayor in Georgia, the Honourable Patsy Jo Hilliard and Mayor Deana Ingraham. The meeting emphasized the need for collective action, championing gender equality, amplifying women's voices, and creating an inclusive future.

GHANAIAN CANADIAN CHAMBER OF COMMERCE BUSINESS CONFERENCE

Dr. Nadia Adongo Fynn, Deputy Director of the Diaspora Affairs was a speaker at the Ghanaian Canadian Chamber of Commerce Business Conference. In her recent address at the Ghanaian-Canadian Chamber of Commerce's Business Conference in Toronto, emphasized the vital role of the Diaspora Affairs Office of the President, in strengthening ties with our diaspora community. She highlighted key initiatives, including the Diaspora Engagement Policy, presented to the cabinet, and the upcoming implementation of the Ghana Card as a primary form of ID. Dr. Fynn also addressed inquiries regarding the NACOC Bill 2023, which assigns the Ministry of Interior the responsibility to issue licenses for cannabis cultivation, marking a significant step towards harnessing cannabis's industrial and medicinal potential. This legislative stride is set to establish a well-regulated cannabis sector, adhering to stringent quality standards and ushering in a sustainable healthcare marketplace.

AMOS BURSARY & SCHOLARS VISIT DAOOP

The Amos Bursary and its Scholars recently visited the Diaspora Affairs Office at Ghana's Jubilee House, highlighting the scholarship role in impact the lives of UK students of African Heritage and their recent internship placements at corporations in Ghana. The Amos Bursary's mission is to empower young individuals of African and Caribbean heritage from the UK, enabling their success in education and beyond. This is achieved through scholarships for higher education at esteemed institutions like Oxford, Cambridge, UCL, LSE, Bristol, Loughborough, and others. The bursary takes a comprehensive approach to shaping futures, promoting excellence, and establishing high achievement as the norm. Employing a collaborative model for personal and professional growth, the Amos Bursary aims to empower British youth of African and Caribbean descent to realize their academic and career potentials, while also contributing to their communities. The discussions with Einstein Ntim (Innovation and Engagement), representing Director Akwasi Awua Ababio, revolved around reshaping perceptions of young people of African descent and combatting negative stereotypes about Afro-Caribbean communities in the UK addressing social mobility and workforce diversification. The meeting also emphasized successful internship placements for scholars and the significance of reconnecting with Africa to foster connections. The Amos Bursary encourages the UK diaspora community to explore opportunities for higher education, highlighting programs like theirs, and invites accomplished members of the diaspora to mentor aspiring individuals striving for educational and professional excellence.

PAN AFRICAN VILLAGE VISIT DAOOP

Children in the summer cohort of the Afro Parenting Village were shown the Office of the President at the Jubilee House as part of the developmental objectives of encouraging Diaspora families to return and re-integrate to Ghana. This was an aspirational experience for the young children with many speaking of wanting to move to Ghana and help do their part for their country, including a young girl saying she will want to be President one day. Often times one of the biggest hurdles facing experts and leaders in the diaspora who are moving to Ghana are challenges around their children and the integration into Ghana. This is why organizations that help families and children in being able to adjust to the culture are pivotal to diaspora engagement. Afro Parenting Village (formerly Destination Africa) is centred around the values of Patience, Unity, and Respect, with a diverse range of offerings, including their on-demand online academy, parenting workshops, family events, african languages and resources and community-based parenting forum. We celebrate the integral role families play in Ghana's diaspora engagement process.





RT. HON JAMES CLEVERLY VISIT TO GHANA & THE BRITISH INTERNATIONAL INVESTMENT (BII) BUSINESS RECEPTION

The Diaspora Affairs Office of the President honored the invitation by the British High Commissioner, H.E Harriet Thompson, at the Business Reception & Expo, commemorating 75 years of British International Investment (BII) a driver of economic growth and investment prospects . Esteemed Guest of Honour, UK Secretary of State for Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Affairs, Rt. Hon James Cleverly, graced the event. Notably, Chris Chijiutomi, Managing Director and Head of Africa, engaged with Director Akwasi Awua Ababio, discussing strategies to empower diaspora communities for impactful investment in African entrepreneurship and socio-economic advancement. The occasion showcased a curated exhibition spotlighting innovative initiatives within the climate, energy, and tech sectors, underscoring the achievements of these SMEs in propelling innovation and sustainability.

BII is the UK government's development finance institution, managed by the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office, with a robust investment portfolio valued at US\$7.1 billion (year-end 2020), concentrates on emerging markets in South Asia and Africa. The exhibited ventures spanned diverse domains such as Artificial Intelligence driven farming, electric bikes, chip-powered water filtration systems, aquaculture, and more. 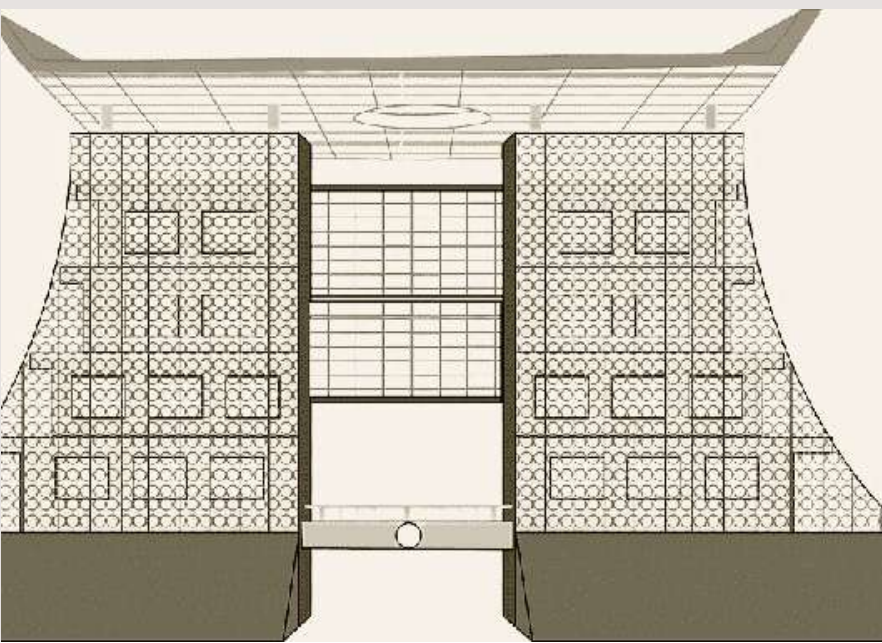
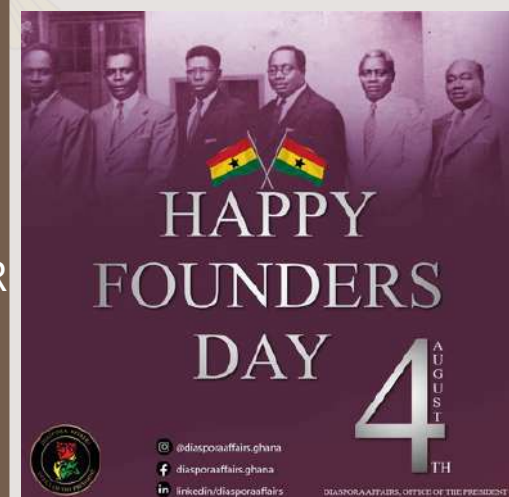
